

Tuesday, November 21, 2023

At the regular monthly meeting of the Mt. Gretna Campmeeting Association Board of Managers, held on Tuesday evening, November 21, 2023, in person at the Mt. Gretna United Methodist Church and via Zoom Webinar, Pat Wilmsen presided.

A quorum was present including the following: (in person) Miles Bojanic, Marcie Lloyd, Ted Martin, Esther Mefferd, Jeff Minnich, Kevin Wells, Pat Wilmsen, (and via Zoom) Ann Bering, Kevin Burd, and Joe Lamont. George Leyh was excused.

Seven Members (four households) were represented in person, and Nineteen Members (Fifteen households) attended via Zoom.

1) Call to Order, Pat Wilmsen

The President called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Marcie Lloyd conducted the roll call.

2) Water Tower Art Discussion, Kerry Royer, Guest

Kerry Royer, Director of the Mt. Gretna Art Show, stated that as part of the 50th anniversary of the art show, a special committee has been established to promote the celebration of the arts in our community. Fundraising is being done to sponsor special celebrations. The committee plans to use these funds to sponsor The Year of the Arts. One of the projects they are proposing would be the production of a vinyl wrap with custom art for the water tower. If the Campmeeting agrees in principle, the Board would be able to give final approval for the design. The wrap would be completely installed at no cost to the MGCA.

3) Approval of Minutes

a) Since the Minutes of the October Board meeting were distributed to Board members prior to the time of this regular monthly meeting, the reading of the Minutes was dispensed with and the October 17, 2023 minutes were approved on a motion by Jeff Minnich. The motion was seconded by Kevin Burd and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor.

The Treasurer's report was given for October draft financials.

8) New Business

- a) The proposed committee list for 2024 was presented.
- b) The Tabernacle's sound system is shared by multiple organizations which can cause problems for an organization's sound settings. In order to preserve sound system settings, improvements are required. Kevin Wells made a motion to release money from the Heritage Festival Fund to make improvements to the Tabernacle sound system which will allow multiple users to preserve sound settings; expenses not to exceed \$800. The motions was seconded by Marcie Lloyd and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor. Resolution #2023.11.21-01
- c) Ted Martin made a motion to approve the slate of Trustees presented for the Tabernacle Association, and to affirm Ted Martin as President, Bob Kettering as Vice-President, Shawn Gingrich as Treasurer, and Pat Wilmsen as Secretary. All officers will be confirmed at the January meeting of the Board of Trustees of

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the Tabernacle Association. The motion was seconded by Esther Mefferd and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor. **Resolution** #2023.11.21-02

- d) Jeff Minnich made a motion to authorize Bartlett Tree Service to cut down a dead Ash tree located at the corner of Bell Avenue and 1st Street. This tree was certified dead by Bartlett Tree Service. The motion was seconded by Esther Mefferd and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor. Resolution #2023.11.21-03.
- e) Jeff Minnich made a motion to approve the tree removal permit submitted for 712 5th Street to remove a bifurcated Chestnut Oak tree, half of which is dead, at their expense and as indicated on the sketch on the permit application be approved. The motion was seconded by Miles Bojanic and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor. Resolution #2023.11.21-04.
- f) Jeff Minnich made a motion to approve the tree removal permit submitted for 405 2nd Street to remove a diseased White Pine tree, per arborist recommendation, at their expense and as indicated on the sketch on the permit application be approved. The motion was seconded by Marcie Lloyd and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor. **Resolution** #2023.11.21-05.
- g) Miles Bojanic made a motion that the building permit application submitted by 212 Boehm Avenue to enclose a portion of the porch along Boehm Avenue for the purpose of adding a bathroom as indicated on the submitted plans, be approved, contingent on receiving an easement from the Campmeeting Association and having the project approved by West Cornwall Township. The motion was seconded by Jeff Minnich and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor. **Resolution #2023.11.21-06**.
- h) Miles Bojanic made a motion to approve the easement application submitted by the owners of 212 Boehm Avenue, with the understanding that the easement shall be for the portions of the existing structure, both 1st and 2nd floors, on MGCA property that is not already included in the former easement. This easement does not expand the current footprint of the house. The motion was seconded by Joe Lamont and passed with Bering, Bojanic, Burd, Lamont, Lloyd, Martin, Mefferd, Minnich, and Wells voting in favor. Resolution #2023.11.21-07.

9) Community Comment

- a) Peggy Lichty, 205 Castle Ave. Discussed community involvement in board meetings. Asked what the Board might be doing about property blight issues.
- b) Joy Linton, 211 7th Street. Discussed West Cornwall Township's parking requirements for MGCA residents.

10) Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m. on a motion by Kevin Wells, seconded by Esther Mefferd and passed unanimously.

The next regular meeting will be held Tuesday, December 19, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom Webinar. [Note: on November 28, 2023, the Executive Committee decided that the December, January, and February regular monthly board meetings would be held via Zoom only. Hybrid meetings will recommence with the spring.]
