

Guidelines for Visitors, Guests and Renters in Mt. Gretna Campmeeting

Highlights from the Rules & Regulations of the Mt. Gretna Campmeeting Association

Quiet Hours

Everyone is expected to maintain quiet hours from 10 p.m. until 7 a.m. and all day Sunday year round. In addition, quiet hours are in effect all day beginning July 15th and going through August 31st every summer for our “Quiet Season.” Visitors, guests and renters must keep the volume of televisions, audio systems and social occasions to a respectable decibel level.

Driving in Mt. Gretna Campmeeting

Mt. Gretna Campmeeting is pedestrian friendly and many streets are pedestrian only. Driving on pedestrian-only streets, speeding and reckless driving are strictly prohibited throughout the Campmeeting. GPS and online map sites may not recognize pedestrian-only streets so please observe posted signs. Driving on these streets can result in vehicle and property damage.

Parking in Mt. Gretna Campmeeting

All streets and walkways are designated as fire lanes. Parking of motor vehicles is permitted only in designated parking areas. Note that not all cottages have designated parking areas. Vehicles can be parked at the Campmeeting lot near the playground off of 1st Street or the parking lot near the Mt Gretna Fire Hall. Visitors, guests, and renters may park at the church parking lot (owned by the Mt. Gretna United Methodist Church) when it is not in use for church programming. Sundays from 8 am until noon and any other time when the church posts signage for special events, the parking lot is not available to MGCA members and guests.

Outdoor Grilling

Charcoal or LP gas burners and other open-flame cooking devices shall not be operated on combustible covered porches or within 10 feet of combustible construction. Such devices must be attended when in use and fully extinguished when not attended.

Pets

Dogs must be leashed when on Campmeeting property. Pet owners must not allow their animals to litter the private property or the common property of the Campmeeting such as walking paths, streets, and park facilities. All litter must be removed and disposed of promptly and properly. Stations with doggy litter bags are available at the Mt. Gretna Community Library and at Memorial Park.

No Drinking, No Smoking

Drinking and smoking in public areas of the Mt. Gretna Campmeeting are not permitted.

Fire Siren

Mt. Gretna is serviced by a volunteer fire company that is alerted to emergencies by a fire siren. This siren can go off at all hours of the day and night. Don't panic.
